# President's Message

I hope everyone had a an enjoyable summer.

This month's speaker will be Gerry Kersus, W1GD, who will be discussing "Top Band Contesting: Fun on 160M." Gerry lives in Holden. He grew up in Worcester and was first licensed as WN1FBX in August 1965. After graduating from WPI in 1971, he moved to MD and then to NJ where he lived until 2013. In 1976, he traded in his call to become W1GD. He's been an active DXer and contester for over 50 years and is a member of the Frankford Radio Club, the South Jersey DX Assoc., the Yankee Clipper Contest Club and the Central MA ARA. Gerry's a letter sorter (C) for the W1 QSL Bureau and was a volunteer at WRTC 2014. He still travels to the Jersey Shore to each January to operate in the CQ 160M Contest with the W2GD Team.

October's speaker will be our own Ken Poole, KB1TYK, who will be discussing "High Speed Morse Interception in Germany during the Building of the Berlin Wall." Ken is a graduate of Natick High School Class of 1959, and holds the Bachelor of Architecture and Master of Architecture Degrees from the University of Illinois. A member of the Boston Society of Architects and the American Institute of Architects, he currently practices in Milford, MA and Jacksonville Beach, FL (when the snow falls). At the time covered by this discussion, Ken was a U.S. Army Tech Sergeant/SP5 058.39, stationed in Germany, at Fort Devens and at the US Army Security Agency Training Center. He will be providing an overview and historical prospective of the Cold War in Europe from 1959 to 1962 during the building of the Berlin Wall and the role played by the US Army Security Agency/National Security Agency in High Speed Morse Interception of the Soviet Union, DDR and other Soviet Satellite countries.
