General Crash Course

Ed, W1NXC

Sign up now for FARA's General "crash" course which will be eld at the club shack Oct 20, 27, and Nov 3, 2012, Saturday morning from 9 to 12 noon. No text, no fee, Techs and Novices welcome.

Why upgrade to General class? Here are a few reasons.

Passing the General exam opens up a lot of new frequencies, i.e., frequencies not previously available to Novice or Tech licensees. There are specific segments in the 40m, 20m, and 80m bands where Generals are allowed and you also will have the same frequency privileges that Advanced and Extra operators enjoy on 160m, 50m, 30m, 17m, 12m and 10m. That is a huge amount of bandwidth!

The most important and rewarding result of upgrading to General, however, is the availability of the so-called "DX" frequencies that enable one to communicate world-wide.
