This was followed by a short presentation by Fred Biehold, NV1N, (who has done a presentation for us before on how to write and pass traffic within the NTS). **Board Meeting:** We are planning an **important Board meeting** for Saturday March 2, 2019 at the McAuliffe branch of the Framingham Public library starting at 10 am. Please note this is the McAuliffe branch not the main library. We have to discuss filling open positions, the Flea market, and other topics. Please let me and Victor K1VEA know which non-officers might be attending. All are welcome. We usually have room for at least 10 -12 or more.

**Echolink:** Andy, KC1DMM, and Morris, N1AVP have been working on the Echolink project. I have checked into one net using Echolink entirely and stayed on the whole net. On the Echolink program or application, it is now listed as W1FY-R, or Node 279337, not KC1DMM anymore. This option has allowed some regular club members who can't usually reach the repeater, to check into the weekly net. My recommendation would be to check into the repeater on Echolink a few minutes before the Sunday or Wednesday night nets, get someone's attention by voice, so they know you are there and they can tell net control and the others. There is only about 1 second by my measurements between the repeater signal coming in and the Echolink signal coming it to my house when I listen to both. If you are net control (or anyone) and you are responding to someone speaking on Echolink, you can proceed as usual in your response. When you hear them end their transmission, you can proceed to respond. But if you are requesting Echolink check ins or talking to someone on Echolink, your signal has to go through the network, to them, they have to prepare their response, say it and it has to come back through the network to the repeater. Please allow at least several extra seconds when asking for Echolink check-ins to get back to you. If there is a lot of activity on the repeater, the Echolink might not clear on the computer end for transmission long enough for someone to make a transmission on that mode. So slow down. take a deep breath, ponder the meaning of life, consider what new radios you might want to purchase and be patient for the Echolink response.

**Nostalgia:** I reviewed the January and February 2009 Circuits, which are available on our website. The club had just identified a new EMCOMM representative and that was the hot topic. As we will here from Rob, KD1CY, this remains an important topic. There was talk of a Chinese buffet night out back then, anyone interested in one?
