

#### **QSL Card**

I've always been a believer in handwriting my outgoing QSL cards. Computer-generated labels seem so impersonal, after the direct contact of a QSO! However, after massive amounts of QSL cards came flooding from a couple of Worked All Europe contests, I reconsidered.

Boris T93Y, who serves as a QSL manager for several stations, spoke so highly about the label-generating software BV, I finally decided to give it a try. Good decision!

One of the great things about BV is the price: it's freeware (find it on the Web at http://www.qsl.net/df3cb/bv.html)

Unfortunately, BV isn't the most userfriendly software to figure out at first. However, I was lucky to have Boris to offer long-distance help. And once you get the hang of it, it's pretty painless: Type in the callsign of the received card, mark the QSOs you want printed, keep doing that until you've gone through your stack of incoming cards, then send the whole pile off to the print queue.

The software accepts a number of different log formats, including CT. Labels can be printed in prefix order, so the cards are already sorted for sending to the bureau. You can design your own label layout pretty easily. Boris even added a note field in for us and input data so the cor

rect operator on Team KC1YR shows up for each QSO.

In my Luddite days, I'd typically answer a pile of contest cards from the bureau over the course of several evenings. I went through my first BV batch in under an hour, including pasting labels onto the cards.

For the ragchewing QSOs I do at my home station, I'm still going to hand-write the cards. But for contest QSLing, it's now BV all the way -- as our latest Worked All Europe QSL card shows (note the space for the label).

Jan. 12, 1934

The 18<sup>th</sup> regular meeting of the Comm. Amateur Radio Club was called to order at 8:10 pm by president William LaBarr. The secretary's report was read and accepted. After the reading of the minutes, the secretary presented the treasurer's report. Moved by N. L. Thompson to accept report, seconded and so voted.

Moved by Mr. Tedford to donate the sum of \$5.00 to the Civic League for the purpose of defraying expense of light, heat and rent for past year. Seconded and so voted.

The report of Nomination Committee was read by Mr. Tedford and consisted of the following names:

President J. D. McLean Vice-Pres. C. R. Crosby

Treas. E. M. Parsons
Secretary A. L. Schaltenbrand

Activities Manager N. L. Thompson A ballot was taken and the nomination committee's selections were elected. The new officers then took charge of the meeting.

Moved by Wm. LaBarr that the club open a banking account for the convenience of the Treasurer. Seconded and so voted.

President McLean appointed by following committees.

Program Committee: Herbert Blanke, Ted Love

Q.R.M. and Technical Committee: C.R. Crosby, F. L. Tedford, P. Ruland Membership Committee: Wm. LaBarr, Wallace Coffim

Publicity man: Bob Cunningham

No further business being before the meeting, it was adjourned by unanimous vote.

Following the business meeting, a fine talk was given by George K. Bailey W1KH of Weston, New England director of the A.R.R.L. Mr. Bailey gave us a good explanation of the controversy between Magazine R/9 and the A.R.R.L. He extended an invitation to club members to attend a Hamfest to be held Feb. 17, at Hotel Bradford Boston. Time 12:00 p.m. Price 1.25. He also had on exhibition an excellent five meter transmitter.

At the conclusion of the talk, members gathered around for discussion and to examine the National Guard transmitter which we had on exhibition.
