

This month's QSL card came from the FARA archives. W1FY worked Jim, VK9NS, in December, 1991, on 10 meter CW near the peak of the last solar cycle. Jim's QTH is on Norfolk Island, a pretty rare DXCC entity to work from this part of the world.

A few words about Jim. VK9NS is a member of the elite CQ Magazine DX Hall of Fame. He was first licensed in 1947 and, since then, has operated from more rare DX locations than most hams ever dream of operating from. Many DX'ers around the world have this QSL card.

Norfolk Island is a volcanic island in the South Pacific. It was first inhabited by the Polynesians. Captain James Cook discovered Norfolk in 1774 and claimed it for Great Britain. The island was named in honor of the Duchess of Norfolk. It is the home of the Norfolk pine tree. The island was also the home of

one of the most brutal prisons establishments ever established by Britain. In 1856, the island received those who call it home today - the Pitcairners, descendents of the Bounty Mutineers and their Tahitian companions.

Norfolk Island was annexed to Tasmania in 1844, became a dependency of New South Wales in 1896, and was transferred to the Commonwealth of Australia in 1913. Many of the old prison colony buildings have been restored and contribute to the island's main industry, tourism. Limited self-rule was granted to Norfolk Island in 1979.

Feb. 23, 1934

The 21st regular meeting of the C.A.R.A. was called to order at 8:30 p.m. by Vice Pres. Dr. Crosby. The secretary's report was read and accepted. It was suggested that the club hold a raffle to stimulate interest. After a discussion it was decided to buy some 5 meter apparatus and the details of the raffle were left to a committee appointed by Dr. Crosby. The committee appointed, was as follows: Herb Blanke, Ted Valpey, Bill LaBarr, and Ed Parsons

There being no further business before the meeting, it was adjourned by unanimous vote.
