Massachusetts House Bill H-2512

This bill, entitled "An Act Amending the Zoning Act to Reference Federal Regulations Concerning the Construction of Amateur Radio Antenna Structures", has been sent to committee for study. The bill would formalize the PRB-1 decision into Massachusetts law (Federal preemption of antenna ordinances). This bill would prevent unreasonable local restrictions of antenna structures. To support this bill, write your State Representative. A sample letter might read:

"I ask you to support H-2512, which is before the Committee on Local Affairs. As an amateur radio operator, I volunteer my time and services to support (Framingham) emergency services. By passing this bill, you will make it easier for amateur radio operators in Massachusetts to obtain building permits for their antenna structures. This will encourage additional amateurs to construct antenna systems which will, in times of emergency, provide increased amateur radio communications resources to assist our local emergency management agency function. This improvement in emergency preparedness of the Commonwealth would be obtained at no cost to the taxpaver."
