

Just 60 Years Ago

On January 24, 1933, the first meeting of the group now known as the Framingham Amateur Radio Association was held in Ashland, MA at the home of the Reverend Mark Strickland, for the purpose of founding an amateur radio club. The following officers were elected by single nomination and unanimous vote. President W.L. La Barr, Treasurer C.P. Marcoux, Secretary Dr C.R. Crosby.

Several suggestions as to the name of the new club were presented, Middlesex Radio Club, Short Wave Radio Club, and Community Radio Club. The name Community Radio Club was selected by popular vote. Moved and seconded that the dues be 25 cents per month and that meetings be held on the 2nd and 4th

Fridays of the Month. Moved and seconded by Dr Crosby that an active interest in amateur radio telegraph or telephone be the only requirements for membership.

The following members were present at the first meeting: Mark Strickland, Steve Anderson, Norman Thompson, Dr Crosby, W.L. LaBarr, E.H. Parsons, Harold Williamson, C. P. Marcoux and Warren Pierce


