Several people seemed particularly interested in the terrible problems (ex) Soviets have getting equipment that is easy to buy and relatively affordable in the West.

I want to let them (and everyone else) know about an organization called FAIRS. They are working to send equipment to the ex-USSR (they've also sent some medicine, and were invited to the recent U.S.-sponsored conference on aiding the Commonwealth of Independent States! They also do good work elsewhere in the world). They've already set up some packet/AMTOR stations over there, and have gotten some donated computers they hope to bring over in May. If anyone is interested in finding out more, you can contact them at Box 341, Floyd ,VA 24091. They request a \$10 donation to join.

Incidentally, one of the donated PCs they have acquired is hopefully going to club station UC1AWZ, which is managed by a very dear friend of mine. He runs classes for school children there, and I thought it would be wonderful if they could have the digital modes at the station. I now need to come up with a multi-mode TNC for them. If anyone has any ideas, please let me know!!

My friend Serge knows about W1FY, since I've told him a lot about our club (after my talk, some people signed a letter to him). He is hoping that once he gets packet, his club and our's could exchange messages (I didn't bother telling him that, at the moment, we were not exactly set up to send packet ourselves) Serge has also offered to help W1FY members with cards to and from the ex-USSR/CIS states. If you have any cards that you would like forwarded, let me know and I will send a package in a couple of weeks. Serge is planning to visit the US this summer and hopes to have the chance to meet hams from W1FY during that time. As plans become more definite, I'll keep everyone posted.


