PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: Since the last Circuit, we have had the following meetings:

March 4, 2021 Monthly Meeting: Highlights from the minutes.

- Treasurer's Report 41 Paid Members so far. Annual Report filed with the State. A \$500 donation was
 made to the Framingham Police Association with Sgt Paul Patriarca K1PMP as beneficiary because he
 and his family lost their house and all they own due to a fire last month. This was approved at a Board
 Meeting.
- Steve Moro also asked us to chose for the April meeting what webinar by the ARRL from a list of topics for us to select. We were going to use one of these for the April meeting but instead will use one of these for some other meeting.
- Presentation by W1RH Bob Hess on the History of WBZ Radio and TV. From Steve Babbitt:

"Besides the history, particularly interesting was on the towers and antennas used that linked the various radio and TV stations in the Greater Boston area. Westinghouse owned many commercial broadcasters. Hurricanes and other serious storms presented major challenges and fascinating stories that kept us riveted to this subject. No one wanted this presentation to end. Additional thanks go to W1BNC Mike Keller who provided numerous details."

April 1, 2021 Monthly Meeting: Highlights from minutes.

• From Steve Babbitt:

"240 square Miles were destroyed and 85 people lost their lives. In a disaster cell towers need the internet and when the internet is down so are mobile phones because they only have single point access to a specific tower. That's when the radio is the viable way to communicate. Tragic events like this go beyond 1st Responders and require community involvement. With the use of GMRS & FMRS average citizens can help. This second part of this presentation focused on how the local HAMs organized and directed average citizen involvement. That aroused even more interest from us to learn what they did. It is important to note in a disaster we are on our own as 1st responders have limitations. "When you need me most, I probably won't be able to get to you." Beyond being self-reliant, we must organize as small neighborhoods that can increase our awareness before a crisis hits. This presentation was superb keeping our interest for a couple of hours."

• By the way, if any member has a GMRS radio and uses it regularly or has a GMRS repeater, please let us know. We would like to know more about this. I listen regularly to a cheapo FMRS radio on

scan and have heard some locals and a local repeater. We are not supposed to use the FMRS to talk on their repeaters.

- I, KB1VXY, host the Yankee 6 Meter SSB Net, a net that has been in operation since the 1960s, every Sunday morning at 9:30 am local time on 50.272 USB. Check-ins are increasing rapidly over the past few months. 6 Meters works well for local communication, even with a tuned multiband dipole, but a yagi is preferred and horizontally polarized. Some FARA members check into this net.
- Leandra, AF1R, from Needham, MA hosts a 10 meter net, every Thursday at 8 pm on 28.3333 USB. Some FARA members are on this net. She recently added a RTTY net at 9 pm on 28.11111, on the odd Thursdays following the SSB net. Next one 4/15/21. Try this out!
