June 3, 2021: 19 members attended by Zoom

- Treasurer's Report
 - Re-issuing the \$500 check to the Police Dept. Association for Paul Patriarca, K1PMP. They could
 not confirm receipt of the initial check so it was cancelled, and a new one was hand delivered by
 Steve, N1MH, to Officer Andrews Lewis.
- **VEC Report**: The City had not opened their facilities to us. Shortage of City personnel.
- **Training room report:** Not available for meetings yet. We discussed the possibility of continuing with Zoom even if we have access to the room, to have some kind of hybrid meeting to allow out of state members to attend.
- **Repeater Report** Everything working okay.
- **Echolink Report** Restored and working fine now.
- Other business Club Insurance Policy discussed. Must have clearly defined coverage in writing. We did not renew the policy and will review the options.
- **Field Day**: Still no answer on set up in the backyard of the McAuliffe Branch Library. Equipment discussed if we have FD at the Library. At least 3 members have working club radios, batteries, charge controllers and tuning capabilities. See below.

More nets and activities to consider:

- I, KB1VXY, host the Yankee 6 Meter SSB Net, a net that has been in operation since the 1960s, every Sunday morning at 9:30 am local time on 50.272 USB. Check-ins are increasing rapidly over the past few months. 6 Meters works well for local communication, even with a tuned multiband dipole, but a yagi is preferred and horizontally polarized. Some FARA members check into this net.
- Leandra, AF1R, from Needham, MA hosts a 10 meter SSB net, every Thursday at 8 pm on 28.33333. Some FARA members are on this net. She recently added a digital net at 9 pm on odd date Thursdays. I have checked into a couple of these. She starts with RTTY45 and we have tried BPSK31, an Olivia variant, Feld Hell, Domino, and others. I have learned a lot and worked out several bugs in just a few sessions. We monitor W1FY for any questions. Next digital net is on Thursday June 17, 2921 at 9 pm on 28.11111 USB.
- Comment on HF Digital Modes: All Hams should be able to operate with some of these modes. Download FLDIGI (free) and at least monitor the net and play around with the settings. A signalink or equivalent is needed for best operations. However, you could copy the digital info using just your radio and the computer with FLDIGI on it if you place the mic of the computer near enough to the radio's speaker, or alternatively use headphones and put them over the mic. You need a quiet background to do this. I have also transmitted some of these modes without signalink by putting the mic of the radio near the computer speaker. It is much easier with a signalink or equivalent. Some of the NBEMS (Narrow Band Emergency Messaging System) modes can be used with just a handheld and a computer and an air interface.
- Joe, W1HAI, from Natick hosts the Saturday Night Special 10 meter net on Saturday evenings at 8 pm on 28.305 MHz. Several FARA members check in.
