# FARA Member Spotlight: Ron Lahti, N1CNG

N1CNG joined our radio club fairly recently. If you check his QRZ page, you will discover that he has an impressive background in EmComm and FEMA courses. He performed a great service to our club last June, when he facilitated an outstanding Field Day effort at Crow Island in Stowe. Ron now has a new project – one that can be of direct benefit to FARA. He has purchased a trailer, and he is fitting it out for serious ham radio mobile use. He is inviting our radio club to join in a wide array of ham activities. A few possibilities are:

- Field Day
- POTA (Parks on the Air)
- IOTA (Islands on the Air)
- SOTA (Summits on the Air)
- Lighthouse Activations
- An EmComm self-contained mobile station
- Ham Radio Training



Ron is continuing to build out the trailer, which is presently a work in progress. Among the items installed so far are flooring, two storage cabinets, two 4-foot workstation desks, and a 1500 watt space heater. In addition, Ron has acquired a 3500 watt gas generator, 400 watt solar panels with three 200Ah batteries, 1000 and 2500 watt inverters, two and three node waterproof intelligent chargers, and an assortment of extension cables.

The trailer is being equipped with HF, VHF, and UHF all-mode radios. These include (2) IC-7300 (HF), IC-9700 (VHF/UHF), IC-7100, and FT-857D, and Ron has many more radios available as needed. Antennas include a Mini Tarheel HF Vertical with all needed radials, and other multi-band wire antennas. Also included are a 50 foot mast, and a 30 foot mast, with two military tripod bases and variable height masts. He has also purchased four new 11.8 inch laptop computers, and has loaded them with N1MM+ and WSJT software.

Ron has also purchased a wide array of bandpassfilters, covering bands from 6 meters to 160 meters, including all the WARC bands.

N1CNG has spent an impressive amount of his own time and money on his ham radio trailer project. We thank him for his generous offer of joint radio activities in the future, and look forward to some interesting trailering adventures. Congratulations, Ron!
