Gordy was a ham's ham. He knew everybody, and seldom had a problem getting speakers for our monthly club meetings. For years he managed our annual FARA Flea at Keefe Tech. He was always right on top of all the many details – everything

from selling the vendor tables to remembering to tip the janitor at the end. As always, Gordy did a superb job.

Gordy was a "foodie." He always made sure that we had refreshments at our monthly club meetings. Neal, K1NDF, recently reminded me that he was the "donut guy," and it was his job to bring a dozen donuts to the meetings. Gordy also enjoyed having club outings at restaurants.

My Random Memories of Gordy...

- My wife and I went to the annual Boston Flower Show. There was Gordy, Ellen, and Gail, enjoying the displays.
- Gordy took Gail to ARRL Kids Day several times.
- After Gordy came down with Parkinsons, he once rode with me to ARRL Ham Expo, which was in Boxboro at that time. He had a wonderful time meeting his many friends.
- Gordy enjoyed my few visits after he developed Parkinsons. But he enjoyed constant visits from Andy Boughton, KC1DMM, much more. Andy visited Gordy regularly, right to the end.

I am grateful for Gordy's friendship over the last seven years.

I helped Gordy on the flea markets for a couple years. He was very organized, a trait that I do not have. He had everything down to a well-practiced routine. Our hosts at Keefe loved him since all their interactions with him went so smoothly. He took good care of all the regular volunteers. As a result they all came back year after year. Thanks to Gordy the flea markets went without a hitch.

Ham radio was important to Gordy. On several occasions he explained that the dropping of the code requirement was a true tragedy. He had a T-shirt with a picture of a key and, if I remember correctly, the date "the music died". I don't think I ever told him that I can only copy about 5 WPM. He had many other ham radio shirts which he enjoyed wearing. I was honored when Gordy and Ellen gave me a Field Day shirt last year.

One of Gordy's stories was about convincing a good friend to attend a ham course. He emphasized the free food that would be provided. Apparently the food turned out to be fairly minimal. His friend never let Gordy forget the misrepresentation. But the friend did continue and became a dedicated ham.

I maintained contact with Gordy as his health declined. He always did his best to entertain me and make me feel appreciated. He educated me on many Boston topics including the notable moments in Red Sox history.

Gordy made a warm contribution to my life and I miss him.


