meeting. A suggestion has been made that we hold the outing in August.

-- Lew Nyman, K1AZE, Flea Market chairman, gave a report on the upcoming event. There was a request for additional help for both Saturday and Sunday.

-- We were informed the ARRL New England Convention will be held at the Sheraton Boxboro on Oct. 17, 18, and 19. There is a need for Volunteer Examiners for all exam sessions.

-- There will be a demonstration of Amateur Radio at the Museum of Science, Boston, April 26 and 27 and FARA will participate in the event.

-- The meeting was followed by a talk by Tom McGuire from the National Weather Service in Boston.
